Source: WYOMING AMATEUR HOCKEY LEAGUE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. For age divisions that have state wide competition, the top six (6) teams will advance to the playoffs. The six teams will be placed into two brackets (1st, 4th, 6th) and (2nd, 3rd, 5th) with round robin play within the brackets. Championship and consolation games seed by performance in round robin play.

Game Seeding per the WAHL rules and regulations for playoffs:

Division #1 = Seed #1, #4 & #6 (Casper, Laramie & Cheyenne)

Division #2 = Seed #2, #3 & #5 (Jackson, Gillette & Rock Springs)

2. Each game shall consist of three (3) periods

There will a one (1) minute break between periods.

Each team will be allowed one (1) time out lasting one (1) minute per game.

The length of each game shall not exceed ninety (90) minutes and shall be played in three (3)

15-minute, stop-clock periods, except when the following applies:

At the end of the second period, the officials shall determine whether sufficient time remains to complete the game by the curfew time limit. If not, the third period shall be played under running time and shortened as necessary in order to accommodate the curfew time limit.

3. Points shall be awarded as follows.

Win two (2) points

Loss zero (0) points

4. Ties in State Playoff and Championship games. All ties shall be played until there is a winner, as follows:

1.) 5 minute stop time sudden death overtime period.

2.) It still tied, 5 man shootout

3.) If still tied, sudden death shootout until a winner is decided.

5. Tie breaker determining teams for Championship game. If two or more teams have equal points after round robin play in the playoffs, the following formula shall be used to determine which team(s) shall advance to the Championship Game.

1. Head to head play.

2. Goals for versus goals against in round robin play.

3. Goals for / goals against – Highest quotient advances.

4. Lowest total of penalty minutes in round robin play.

5. Coin toss.

Matt Vincent **Casper Oilers - #3 (Defense)**

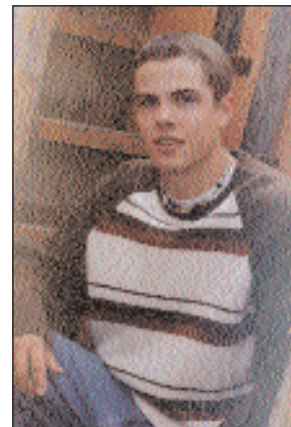

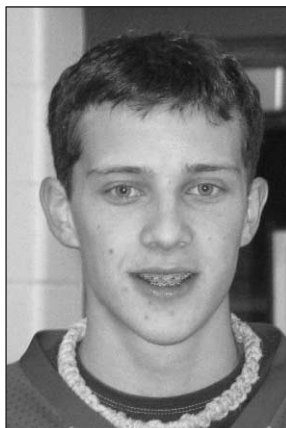
Phillip Cooper **Casper Oilers - #99 (Defense)**

Slade Fedore **Casper Oilers - #91 (Forward)**

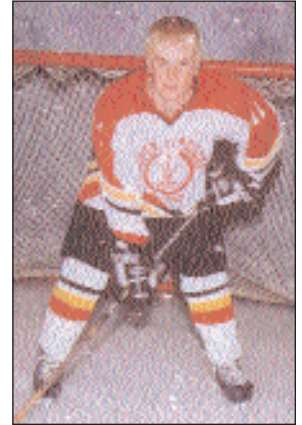

After graduating from high school, Ryan plans to go to college.

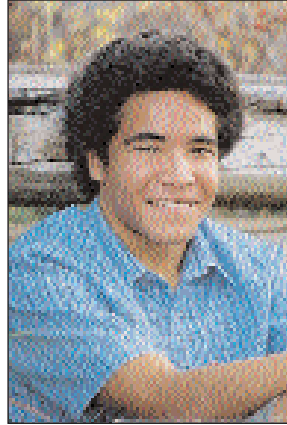

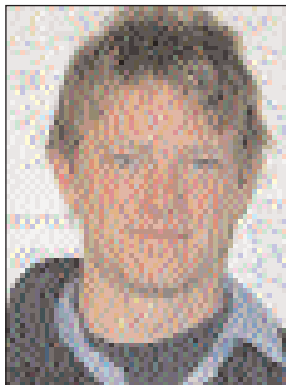

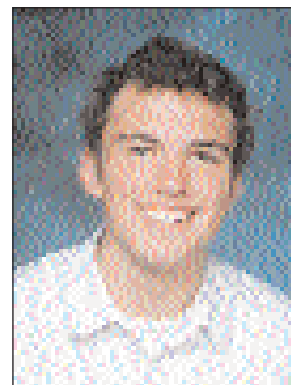
